## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

### TREASURER'S NOTES

You may know me from the monthly Board meetings, either in person or by our videos posted on the web. But what do I do? According to section 7.9 of our HOA Bylaws, the Chief Financial Officer (my official title) is responsible for all things financial. But back to the question "what do I do?" As CFO, I provide the monthly financial status report at our General Board meetings and attend all executive sessions of that Board. I serve as liaison to the Board at the monthly Finance and Facility committee meetings as well as any required support to the IT committee. Along with the HOA president, I verify and authorize payment of all invoices. There have been 477 for the general HOA and 166 for the Café in the last six months. On average, that's 25 per week. Having been CFO for almost 4 years, I have presented several Town Hall meetings in order to help members understand the financial processes. These have included budget preparation, our reserves and how a project gains approval from members, to committees and finally to Board approval. In each of these, I have answered questions from members, sometimes from the floor and other times from people prior to the presentation. That is what I would like to do with this forum. ### Rule Reminder of the Month

All guests must be accompanied by a Resident at all times when using the Lodge Facilities. Residents are responsible for the activity and/or behavior of their guests at all times. Residents are financially responsible for any loss or damage to the Association Property attributable to their guests. Eight guests per day per household are permitted use of designated Lodge Facilities. All guests must register with the Lodge Staff when first entering the Lodge. Any guest not officially registered by a Resident will be requested to do so, if he or she refuses, then they will be expected to leave the Lodge Facilities upon request. The following areas are for the exclusive use of Residents; however, guests may use these areas on a limited basis: Computer Room – Guest must be accompanied by a Resident and may use the computer as long as no other Resident is waiting. Guests must be fourteen (14) years of age or older to use the Computer Room. Fitness Center – Guest must be accompanied by a Resident and may use the equipment as long as no other Resident is waiting. Guests must be fourteen (14) years of age or older to use the Fitness Center. Locker Rooms – No guests are allowed at any time. All guests are allowed to use the Café and Beauty Salon. All guests under fourteen (14) years of age are considered "children" and limitations on the use the Lodge Facilities may apply; please read these Rules completely for specific limitations.

## Neighbor 2 Neighbor

The Neighbor 2 Neighbor Club and our generous Four Seasons Community have helped support the emancipated foster youth at The Dream Center for many years. We thought you would like to know about some of The Dream Center positive data. During the past ten months, 33 formerly homeless foster youth were placed in housing and 90% of the Self Sufficiency Project youth have remained in their housing. Foster youth receiving housing assistance services totaled 164 and 501 household items were distributed (many of those items were from the Four Seasons community – thank you!). In addition to these services, The Dream Center staff provides MediCal assistance, college financial and educational support, job search and resume assistance, computer and phone uses, and even daily snack bags. Many other services are provided and more statistics are available.

The Dream Center staff is very appreciative of our community helping the foster youth obtain the necessities for their first apartment and for the donations of clothes and other items. If you would like to make a donation, please take a look at the Dream Center Wish List that is on the table next to the donation basket in the Arts & Crafts Room.

## Front Yard Alteration Process

We'd like to take an opportunity to remind the community that we have an official process for replacing plants in your front yard. If you'd like to replace your existing plants with ones you enjoy more, please fill out a Front Yard Alteration Request at the front desk.

On the form, please include a simple drawing of your yard that signifies which plants you'd like instead. All replacement plants must come from the community's official landscaping palette. After submittal, our landscaper will review the request and, if approved, will send a confirmation letter with a quote for the total cost of the job. Payment must be submitted within 15 days of receiving your approval letter. Planting occurs in the Spring and Fall-weather permitting.

This is the *only* process by which homeowners can make changes to their front yard landscaping. Homeowners are not authorized to make changes to their plants without ARC approval. Failing to follow these procedures will result in violations that could lead to a reversal of authorized changes by the Association and possible fees/litigation.

If you have a plant or tree that has died, please submit a Front Yard Service Request at the front desk. Replacement of dead trees or plants comes at no cost to the homeowner, but follows the same planting schedule of the Spring and Fall, as weather permits.
